

APOSTROPHE (CONTRACT FORMS)

Apostrophe (') is used to replace letter / letters in a word. It helps to form contract forms of verbs and negatives like 'not'. Apostrophe is used to join noun / pronoun with verb or verb with negatives like not to form word contractions. Apostrophe is used with letters / numbers to denote plural forms. It is never present with personal pronouns.
