## SINGULAR AND PLURAL NOUNS WITH VERBS

A Singular noun agrees with a singular verb.

Singular nouns usually don't end with 'S' but singular verbs end with 'S'.

A Plural noun matches with the plural form of the verb.

Plural nouns usually have 'S' ending but the plural verb stem is without 'S'.

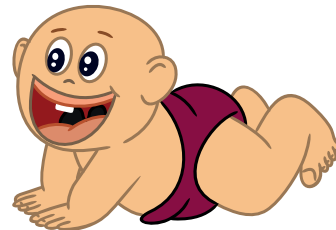
A boy hops. (hop/hops) ✓
